Mayor Good called the regular meeting of the LaMoure City Council to order at 8:00 pm, May 4, 2010 at the Civic Center. Present were: Harris, Hoggarth, Cochrane, Watkins & Ulmer. Absent was: Willey. Also present: Brian Bergantine & Officer Hage.

Hoggarth moved and Watkins seconded to approve the minutes for the April meetings. Polled vote, all yes.

Ulmer moved and Cochrane seconded to approve the Financial report for March. Polled vote, all yes.

Harris moved and Hoggarth seconded to approve the bills for May. Polled vote, all yes.

The Mayor called upon Brian Bergantine of Advanced Engineering. Brian reported that he had talked to Dale Van Eschout of USDA, the remaining funds from the rural water

The Second Reading of the Resolution increasing sewer rates was read and approved. Ulmer moved and Hoggarth seconded to approve the resolution. Polled vote, all yes.

For new business, the Public Buildings committee reported that Davy Bellin's building has 5 years of property taxes due. Attorney McDonagh has drawn up an agreement with Bellin to allow the city to tear down the building now and if the property is not sold before this fall, the property will come back to the city. If the property is sold, the money will go to the city to cover the expense of tearing the building down.

The apartment building at 1st Avenue NW has asbestos siding and there is only 1 bid presented to remove this siding before demolition, L & M Contractors for \$2,500.00. Ulmer moved and Cochrane seconded to approve the bid. Polled vote, all yes. The bids to tear down Bellin's building and the old apartment building on 1st Avenue NW were presented:

Hample Excavation \$ 21,500.00
RTS Shearing \$ 21,000.00

After a short discussion, Hample Excavation was awarded the bid. The council also added that they would like these buildings removed before alumni weekend of June 25th. Cochrane moved and Ulmer seconded to accept the bid. Polled vote, all yes.

The Other Bar had inquired about the city ordinance that states bars are to be closed on Thanksgiving Day. State laws provides that bars may have "on sale" that day but not "off sale". No action was taken, the council tabled this item.

Harris moved and Hoggarth seconded to approve building permits for Wayne McDonagh and Roddy Gentzkow. Polled vote, all yes.

Matt Lano also had a building permit for a shop presented. The council has questions for Lano and tabled the permit until next month.

There was no Municipal Court report.
